Stones
Sand
Soil
Leaves
Organic matter
Litter






EA ban on composting of street sweepings in 2012

Local authority rates suffered

Disposal Costs Increased

Estimated annual sweeping tonnage: 500,000 tonnes



Solution-What we do



Biffa builds street sweepings recycling facility in West Sussex opens in 2015

Hazardous organic residue treated at Biffa bio-remediation plant

60,000 tonnes pa capacity

EA-Approved process


Biffa first to Market with end-to-end solution Recycles sweeping and gulley waste fractions for refuse/recycling






Street cleansing arising's drivers for landfill/EfW diversion

Mid Kent partnership success a platform April 2016 -March 2017 additional 6663 tonnes diverted

Total KCC Tonnage diverted 10788
